

ARIZONA'S 5 C'S

The 5 C's are a *mnemonic**—a phrase or idea that helps you remember something—for the most important parts of Arizona's economy during the state's development. From the time Arizona was a U.S. territory, through statehood in 1912, and into the 20th century, these industries attracted people to the area, provided jobs, and served as the foundation for towns and communities. Although Arizona's economy is changing, the 5 C's are still an important part of our state heritage.

Agriculture (or **farming**) has long been an important industry in Arizona, particularly because of these two crops:




Mining has long played a big role in Arizona's economy, especially because of this mineral:


Ranching is the running of a large farm for raising horses, sheep, or these animals:
