Look at the names of the East/West streets. What do they have in common? **They are the name of Presidents**

Find the Reference Key in the bottom left corner- what building is #15? Can you find it on the map?

The Phoenix Swimming Baths are located on the north-east corner of Van Buren and Central.

Use the Reference Key - what buildings can you find at the below cross streets?

Jefferson/Mohave: #1 **County Courthouse**, #2 **Baptist Church**

Harrison/Centre: #20 **Dutch Ditch**

Yuma/Monroe: #24 **Residence of H.H. McNeil**

Fun Facts:

- The North/South streets that are Native American names on the 1885 map are now numbered, (for example, Apache Street is now 7th Street)
- Phoenix wasn't the capital of Arizona in 1885- Prescott was!
- #19 on the map was a Catholic Church, which is now St. Mary's Basilica. Have you been there? It's right down the street from Heritage Square!
